

# Lincoln-West Back in Session at MetroHealth







# A New Year and New Support for Lincoln-West School of Science and Health

Already a few weeks into its second year of operation, the Lincoln-West School of Science and Health at MetroHealth is at capacity. With 110 10th- and 11th-grade students and 73 new 9th-grade students, it's a good problem to have — but a problem nonetheless.

"We would like to expand so we can offer the program to more students in the Cleveland Municipal School District," said school principal Michelle Kirkwood-Hughes. "We need them desperately in the work force, trying to create a pipeline with our school model."

To meet that need, Lincoln-West School of Science and Health requires more classroom space and a chemistry laboratory.

"MetroHealth was so eager to collaborate with the Cleveland schools because we know the importance of developing talent for the expanding health science field," said Michael Stern, senior vice president and chief of staff at MetroHealth. "A fully functioning chemistry lab at the school is essential; we cannot position students for college and beyond without it."

Open since September 2016, the school combines a traditional curriculum with interactive learning in a health care setting. The older students spend two days a week at the health system's main campus on West 25th Street, while 9th-graders visit one day a month. "Home" is Lincoln-West High School on West 30th Street, two blocks from MetroHealth.

Three local foundations gave Lincoln-West School of Science and Health significant grants to help the school grow. A \$35,000 grant from the **Abington Foundation**; a \$50,000 grant from **The Reinberger Foundation**; and a \$100,000 grant from **The Lubrizol Foundation** all will go toward renovations, classroom space and a new chemistry lab

"We are proud to partner with MetroHealth and the Cleveland Metropolitan School District in support of their ongoing commitment to education in the areas of science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) for underserved youth, a core funding priority for The Lubrizol Foundation," said Lubrizol Foundation President J. Mark Sutherland. "Lubrizol's founders believed that higher education, specifically in the sciences, plays a critical role in building strong businesses and communities."

One of the perks of being at MetroHealth is the students' access to mentors from a variety of health care fields and other supporting areas such as information technology and human resources.

"I want to meet a neurologist so I know what their day is like, what happens when they go into surgery, and after they come out," said sophomore Indya Negron, 15, who chose Lincoln-West School of Science and Health largely because of the mentoring program. "I want to talk to them about what their first surgery was like and what they learned from it."

The mentoring program, which Kirkwood-Hughes hopes to grow, is a key part of preparing students for life beyond graduation, she said, adding, "We want our students to leave high school with a clear vision of what they want their future to look like."


