

Session 1:

- 1 describe Substance Use Disorder as a common and undertreated illness
- 2 describe the Chronic Disease Model of Addiction
- 3 identify Stigma as a barrier to treatment
- 4 recognize Language to use and to avoid when discussing addiction

Session 2:

- 1 describe addiction screening methods
- 2 identify ways to approach discussing addiction
- 3 implement brief intervention using motivational interviewing techniques
- 4 recognize resources for referral to treatment

Session 3:

- 1 describe types of treatment for substance use disorders (SUD)
- 2 identify medications used for treatment of SUD
- 3 implement connection to behavioral treatment for SUD
- 4 recognize peer support resources for SUD

Session 4:

- 1 describe the concept of harm reduction
- 2 converse with patients about their substance use goals
- 3 identify resources to prevent overdose death
- 4 provide patients with tools to increase their safety
