
Message from the Chair...

Primary Care Procedures and Updates: Focus on Pocus

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Please join us as primary care physicians and APPs gain the skills and confidence needed to become a competent Point of Care Ultrasound (POCUS) practitioner. The course will cover the basics of POCUS and can be used as a pathway to receive ultrasound privileges and credentialing at individual institutions. The conference will cover the following aspects of POCUS that has been adapted for full spectrum family medicine training: renal, deep venous thrombosis, musculoskeletal and soft tissue.

In addition, pertinent clinical updates including self-care and health equity topics will be presented and discussed.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

At the end of this conference, participants will be able to:

- 1. State the equipment needed to project an ultrasound image
- 2. Demonstrate the skills to utilize an ultrasound probe in the shoulder, knee, skin, gall bladder and urinary bladder.
- 3. Identify the indications and medications for the treatment of obesity in adults.
- 4. Summarize the updated guidelines for the treatment of sexually transmitted infections.
- 5. List strategies for health equity in the healthcare environment.
- 6. Identify ways to maintain wellness and selfcare.
