ENDOWMENTS AT WORK

Endowments in Nursing support the development and testing of an innovative curriculum to improve competencies in population health management for undergraduate nursing students. Designed in partnership with Mary Dolansky, PhD, RN, FAAN, a faculty member at at the Francis Payne Bolton (FPB) School of Nursing at Case Western Reserve University, this approach utilizes an experienced Academic Clinical Coordinator to support Nurse Manager preceptors at ambulatory practice sites, establishing an academic-clinical practice partnership that not only improves student comprehension but also enhances preceptor development and retention.

The curriculum aligns with the American Association of Colleges of Nursing *Essentials* competency-based education framework in the domains of population health and system-based practice, and it is focused on preparing more practice-ready nurse graduates. The outcomes from the first year of implementation show that:

 Participating students had a better understanding of quality improvement (QI)

- Students scored higher than the non-intervention group on QI posters and projects
- Preceptors at the clinical practice sites that were supported by the Academic Clinical Coordinator acknowledged higher motivation and overall success with the practice site experience

The implementation of the Academic Clinical Coordinator program spawned other project ideas that three Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) students incorporated as part of their required coursework. In addition to completing their practicum hours at MetroHealth, they designed their DNP projects to address these ideas. The resulting projects included:

- A preceptor workshop specific to the ambulatory practice environment
- A mentorship program to provide support for new RN graduates beginning their careers at MetroHealth
- A redesigned ambulatory certification review course, which has since been accessed by more than 500 RNs, both internal and external to MetroHealth



NEWS WORTH CELEBRATING

JoAnn Zlotnick Glick Endowed Fund in Community Health Nursing – Established by JoAnn and Bob Glick as part of their historic investment in The MetroHealth System, the JoAnn Zlotnick Glick Endowed Fund in Community Health Nursing recognizes the impact of nursing leadership on addressing health disparities and improving the health and well-being of the underserved and vulnerable. The fund supports an endowed professorship at the Francis Payne Bolton (FPB) School of Nursing at Case Western Reserve University. This professorship is the first of its kind given to a safety-net hospital. In September 2023, celebrations at MetroHealth and Case Western Reserve University recognized both Glick and inaugural professorship recipient Melissa Kline, DNP, RN, NEA-BC, CENP, who formerly served as Senior Vice President, Chief Nurse Executive at The MetroHealth System.

The events featured keynote presentations from nationally renowned nursing education and research leaders Jeanette

Ives Erickson, Chief Nurse Emerita, Massachusetts General Hospital; and Joanne Spetz, Director, Phillip R. Lee Institute for Health Policy at University of California San Francisco. During a panel presentation, the two discussed the role of nursing in an evolving healthcare system and the critical role that nurses will play in the future of healthcare. which was followed by a lively discussion over lunch with FPB undergraduate students.
