


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Dry Eye

Dry eye has many causes—we treat the symptoms.

Symptoms	Treatment
Blurry vision that comes and goes Feeling that something is in your eye Redness Excessive tearing Sometimes: pain	Conservative:



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Presbyopia

Everyone will get presbyopia as they age.

What it is Lens inflexibility in your 40s-50s that prevents switching from reading far away to close up; causes people to hold reading material at a distance


Treatment

Conservative:

- Reading glasses/bifocals
- Vuity eye drops

Moderate:

• Lens implantation at time of cataract surgery



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Cataracts


Cataracts are among the most treatable eye conditions.

What it is Natural clouding of the lens mostly after age 50 Symptoms

- Decreased vision quality, even with glasses
- Flares around lights at night

Treatment

Cataract surgery: very effective procedure that enters eye through small incisions, breaking up the cataract and implanting an artificial lens



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Floaters

Floaters happen when the jelly that gives your eye structure liquifies.

Symptoms


Treatment

• Noticing what looks like a bug or string in vision

• Can seem to move around

Unless you can't live with the symptoms, there is often little reason to treat floaters.

▲ If floaters are accompanied by flashing lights or a dark curtain, it could indicate retinal problems. Seek care immediately.



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Diabetic Retinopathy

Yearly eye exams are crucial to diagnosing diabetic retinopathy.

What it is Lack of blood—and nutrients and oxygen—to fuel your retina, caused by diabetes **Symptoms**

- Blurry vision
- Loss of vision
- Tiny black floaters
- Often no symptoms—dilated eye exams are crucial!


Prevention is key:

Blood pressure, blood sugar and cholesterol

Well-controlled diabetes doesn't necessarily prevent diabetic retinopathy.

Treatment

- Laser therapy
- Injections
- Surgery



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Macular Degeneration

Macular degeneration is one of the leading causes of serious, permanent vision loss.

What it is

Blurred vision or permanent vision loss, due to damage to your macula—through byproducts (dry) or blood/fluid leakage (wet)

Symptoms

- Decreased vision
- Seeing gaps or squiggles in straight lines


Prevention

- AREDS2 formula vitamins
- Stop smoking
- Eat leafy green vegetables

Treatment

Focuses on slowing the progression

Injections



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Glaucoma

Glaucoma isn't just about eye pressure.

What it is

Damage to your optic nerve that causes vision loss over time


Symptoms

- Many times silent: annual eye exams are key!
- Loss of peripheral vision
- Blurred vision

Treatment

Focuses on keeping eye pressure low

- Eye drops
- Laser therapy



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Keeping Your Eyes Healthy

Most aging eye conditions are easily diagnosed in yearly eye exams.

Focus on your general health: blood supply and oxygen are key.

- Blood pressure
- Blood sugar
- Cholesterol

Prevent eye trauma.

- Wear proper eyewear when mowing or working with dust
- Wear sunglasses

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Annual eye exams are key as you age.
