The 12th Annual Thomas R. Ten Have Symposium on Statistics continues the Columbia-Cornell-NYU-Penn-Yale Symposium, jointly sponsored by these five universities and the Mental Health Statistics Section of the American Statistical Association. The symposium's origins date back to 1998, when informal discussions among Eva Petkova, Ray Carroll, and Tom Ten Have led to the first forum in 1999. The event initially rotated between Columbia and the University of Pennsylvania, with presentations and discussions on statistics in psychiatry. Over time, Yale, NYU, and Cornell joined, and in 2007, the event was renamed to "symposium" to reflect its growth. After Tom Ten Have's passing in 2011, the symposium was renamed in his honor. The Mental Health Statistics Section became a sponsor in 2014, with additional hosting sites, including Northwestern University in 2018 and McLean Hospital in 2023.

The 2025 symposium is co-hosted by the Mental Health Statistics Section of the American Statistical Association, CTSC of Northern Ohio, Case Western Reserve University School of Medicine and Population Health and Equity Research Institute, Center for Health Care Research and Policy, MetroHealth Medical Center.
