Transportation Method





Behavioral Health

Community Hub

- Community-led design process for wraparound community resources
- In partnership with Recovery Resources

Food Access

Farmers Market

Community Health

Empowerment Navigator

- Identifies and connects families who are food-insecure to health/food resources in the neighborhood
- Guides them through the entire process

Housing Justice

Healthy Housing Collaboration

- Design a pilot program in collaboration with 211 and various local partners
- Ensure Old Brooklyn seniors have healthy housing so that they can age in place

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Ongoing Projects

Greenspace Equity

Park Assessments & Focus Groups

- OBCDC partnered with CWRU to implement park assessments & focus groups
- Provided additional context to assist with future programming

Healthy Urban Tree Canopy Grant Program

- Looked at tree canopy within the neighborhood and how we can reforest devoid spaces in the neighborhood
- Residents gave input about their willingness to help maintain or grow the neighborhood canopy
- The “planning” stage

Brighton Park

- Previously a landfill
- It will serve as a space for passive recreation in an area that was lacking greenspace previously

Economic Opportunity

Small Business Grants

- Storefront renovation opportunities for local businesses and entrepreneurs
- Mini grants for small businesses to purchase COVID-19 related items or services

Neighborhood Ambassadors

- Ensure that residents, businesses, and visitors are greeted with a welcoming and safe atmosphere
- Maintains clean areas and a constant presence within the neighborhood
